The application of Faive Gochin, 26 Dec 1921.

He asked to return the family of Sroel Gochin from Russia, province of Tavrichesky, town Melitopol (nowadays Ukraine). The family of Sroel Gochin consisted from him, his wife Khaya, sons – Shmuel, Idel, Yankel, daughters – Esther and Leya.

The paper of the head of Shavl district to the department of citizens' security by the ministry of interior, 6 Mar 1922.

The proofs about the citizenship of family Gochin, which expressed the wish to return to Lithuania, are as follows. They all were born in Papile and lived there till 4 May 1915 (the deportation day of Jews in Shavl district). Sroel Gochin's occupation – butcher and roofer.

The vital records were burnt and destroyed during the WWI and there is no possibility to deliver the birth certificates. It was enclosed the certificate of Papile Jewish community on the witness about the family of Sroel Gochin who is coming from Papile.

The questionnaire

Sroel Gochin was born in Papile in 1866. Did not have any property.

His father Faive Gochin lived in Papile on Stoties (station) St. 10. The relatives in Lithuania – Meyer Simon Gochin, lived in Papile, tradesman, had a shop of small goods.

The certificate of Papile Jewish community issued instead of birth certificates in 20 Dec 1921.

The family of Gochin is really coming from Papile and lived there before WWI.

Sroel Gochin was born in Papile in 13 Nov 1866.

Khaya Gochin was born in Tryskiai (Trishik in Yiddish) in 3 Feb 1876

Leya Gochin was born in Papile in 10 Feb 1899

Shmuel Gochin was born in Papile in 26 Dec 1902

Idel Gochin was born in Papile in 15 Aug 1904

Yankel Gochin was born in Papile in 17 May 1905

Esther Gochin was born in Papile in 18 May 1909

The paper of the council of Papile to the office of head of Shavl district, 28 Feb 1922.

There were not found reasons why family Gochin could not come back to Lithuania.

The application of Faive Gochin should not be satisfied, because there are lack of the documents proving the citizenship of family Gochin.
