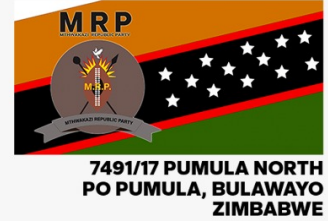

## From Gukurahundi to the Council: The Universal Fragmentation Doctrine in Real Time

*The United Nations has elected the perpetrator state to the chamber that decides on global use of force. The same government is simultaneously dismantling its own constitution to extend its grip on power — and has now ordered its police to threaten any citizen who objects. Mthwakazi states the doctrinal verdict and names the triangle that now defines the choice before the democratic world.*

**Bulawayo, Mthwakazi** — On 3 June 2026, the United Nations General Assembly elected the Republic of Zimbabwe to a non-permanent seat on the United Nations Security Council for the term beginning 1 January 2027.<sup>1</sup> Zimbabwe was the African Group's sole candidate. It ran unopposed. No competitive scrutiny of its governance record was permitted by the regional mechanism that produced its candidacy.<sup>2</sup> Zimbabwe will replace Somalia.

On the same day, the Zimbabwe Republic Police issued a public statement warning citizens that the police would respond "through the full wrath of the law" to anyone who issued "threats to Zimbabweans through social media", who made any "attempt to influence Zimbabweans to revolt against the Government", or who caused "alarm and chaos" in connection with the Constitution Amendment Bill No. 3 deliberations in Parliament. The police declared themselves "on high alert."<sup>3</sup>

The Mthwakazi Republic Party asks the world to hold these three facts together. On the day Zimbabwe was awarded a Security Council seat, its government's parliamentary committee was finalising its recommendation that Parliament adopt the Constitution Amendment Bill No.

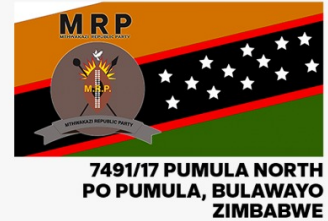

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3, 2026 — a bill that, if passed, extends President Mnangagwa’s term from five to seven years in explicit conflict with Section 328(7) of Zimbabwe’s own Constitution, which prohibits any amendment extending a term of office from benefiting its current holder.<sup>45</sup> Mnangagwa’s second and constitutionally final term was due to expire in 2028. The bill extends it to 2030. And on that same day, the state’s own police issued a public threat to anyone in the country who objected. Today, 4 June 2026, the Bill moves to a vote in Parliament. ZANU-PF holds a two-thirds majority. The Security Council seat, the constitutional coup, and the police intimidation are the same story.<sup>6</sup>

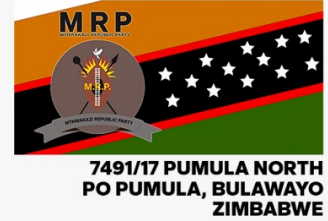

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## A Government That Threatens Its Own Citizens With Death — and Now Threatens Them With Police

Before the international community accepts Zimbabwe's seat at the table of global peace and security, it should know what kind of government Zimbabwe is sending.

In March 2022, President Emmerson Mnangagwa publicly warned at a rally in Chitungwiza that Mthwakazi self-determination advocates are “shortening their lives.” He specifically singled out the Mthwakazi Republic Party — a peaceful, registered political party whose sole instrument is lawful petition.<sup>7</sup> In June 2022, at a rally at Bata Shoe Company in Gweru, the President repeated the threat and “vowed to crush” the Mthwakazi Republic Party, again describing MRP activists as “shortening their lives.”<sup>8</sup> In May 2026, the Southern Eye reported that Mnangagwa renewed the same threat for the third time.<sup>9</sup>

This is the head of state who now holds a non-permanent seat on the body charged with preventing threats to international peace and security. A president who has now warned his own citizens, in his own voice, on three separate occasions, that asking peacefully for political recognition will “shorten” their lives, has been given a platform from which to shape the world's decisions about the use of force.

On 3 June 2026, that intimidation infrastructure was extended formally to the entire Zimbabwean population. The Zimbabwe Republic Police, in an official press statement signed by the Chief Staff Officer (Press and Public Relations) to the Commissioner-General of Police, warned that anyone whose objection to CAB3 reaches “social media”, or whose conduct could be characterised as inciting “revolt against the Government”, or who causes “alarm and chaos,” will face the “full wrath of the law.”<sup>10</sup> The press statement was issued on the same day Parliament took the bill's First Reading, and on the same day the United Nations elected the Zimbabwean government to its Security Council.

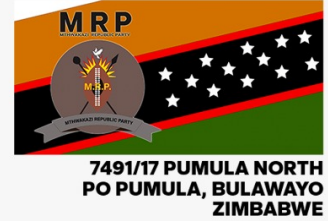

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**The Mthwakazi Republic Party states plainly: a state that threatens its citizens with the law for objecting to a constitutional amendment, while threatening Mthwakazi advocates with their lives for petitioning peacefully, has not earned the seat the world has just given it. This is not legitimacy. This is institutional failure.**

### The Constitutional Coup Happening in Parallel

The Security Council seat was awarded on the same day Zimbabwe's parliamentary joint committee tabled its report recommending adoption of the Constitution Amendment Bill No. 3, 2026.<sup>11</sup> The bill does the following:

Eliminates the direct public vote for president. Under the proposed amendment, Parliament — which ZANU-PF controls — elects the president. The Matabele vote, already structurally underrepresented, is formally extinguished as a check on executive power.

Extends the presidential and parliamentary term from five to seven years, applying to the incumbent. Mnangagwa's second and constitutionally final term expires in 2028. The bill extends it to 2030. The Joint Committee's own report records the minority view that this violates Section 328(7) of the Constitution.<sup>1213</sup> The Committee recommended adoption anyway. Independent commentators project that, if passed, CAB3 would assure ZANU-PF the presidency for the next eighteen years, until 2044.<sup>14</sup>

Vests judicial appointments in the president, with the Judicial Service Commission reduced to a consultative role. Combined with a parallel amendment to the Prosecutor-General's

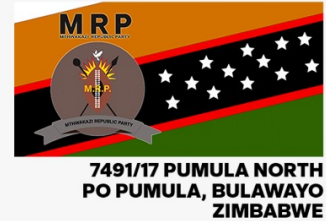

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appointment, the executive now controls the judiciary and the chief prosecutor. Every Gukurahundi accountability case, every MRP legal challenge, every referral from the Uchena Commission's 431 criminal investigations, flows through a judiciary the president appoints.

Repeals Part 6 of Chapter 12 of the Constitution, the constitutional foundation of the National Peace and Reconciliation Commission, the body created specifically to address Gukurahundi and its legacy. Although the Commission's ten-year term expired in 2023, the proposed constitutional repeal extinguishes any prospect of its statutory reconstitution. The legal architecture for transitional justice in Zimbabwe is being formally dismantled.

The public consultation figures published in the Joint Committee's own report tell their own story. Of 540,037 total submissions, 537,102 — 99.5 percent — are recorded as supporting the bill. The provincial public-hearing breakdown is revealing. Harare Metropolitan produced 42,503 written submissions; Mashonaland Central 2,240; Mashonaland West 1,208; Mashonaland East 2,697; Masvingo 13,369; Manicaland 1,837; Midlands 1,597; Bulawayo Metropolitan, Zimbabwe's second city and Mthwakazi's heartland, just 342; Matabeleland North 787; Matabeleland South 1,108.<sup>15</sup> These are not the numbers of a free and equal public consultation. They are the numbers of a process whose support was manufactured in the patronage provinces and whose minority objection has been systematically suppressed for four decades.

### The Doctrinal Verdict

The Mthwakazi Republic Party states the matter plainly. The state that committed Gukurahundi has just taken Somalia's Security Council seat, through an African Union endorsement mechanism that permitted zero competitive scrutiny. The State of Israel recognised the Republic of Somaliland as the first state to do so precisely because it understood that governance capacity, not political solidarity, is the correct criterion for sovereign legitimacy.<sup>16</sup> That same principle now has a live, documentable test case in the Security Council chamber.

Somalia — the state out of whose collapse Somaliland built itself by institutional construction — is replaced on the Council by Zimbabwe, the state whose ruling party presided over the

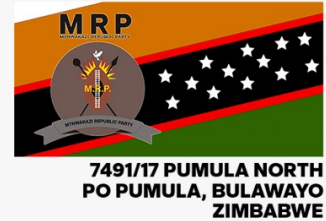

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murder of approximately 20,000 Matabele civilians in the Gukurahundi campaign of 1983 to 1987,<sup>17</sup> and whose own commission of inquiry has documented the loss of three billion United States dollars to politically connected patronage networks.<sup>18</sup> Somalia out, Zimbabwe in. State failure replaced by state failure. Constitutional violation rewarded with international platform. Citizens threatened with police violence rewarded with global diplomatic immunity.

### The Universal Fragmentation Doctrine – Applied

The Universal Fragmentation Doctrine holds that a border drawn without the consent of the peoples inside it carries no moral weight greater than the human dignity of those it confines. It further holds that peoples who build institutions, document their case, exhaust internal remedies, remain lawful, and refuse to disappear deserve to be heard by a world that claims to value self-determination.

Today's vote is that doctrine applied in reverse. The African Union's endorsement mechanism did not assess the governance record of the state it put forward. It structurally protected it. Liberation solidarity among ruling parties took precedence over human dignity and accountability. The result is not an anomaly. It is the system functioning as designed.

The Universal Fragmentation Doctrine does not pause when a perpetrator state is awarded institutional platform. It becomes more urgent.

### The Vote as Exhibit A

The fact pattern of the 3 June election is, by itself, sufficient evidence of the institutional protection the African collective extends to perpetrator states against the peoples within them.

- Zimbabwe was the only candidate the African Group permitted to stand.
- No African state was permitted to challenge it.

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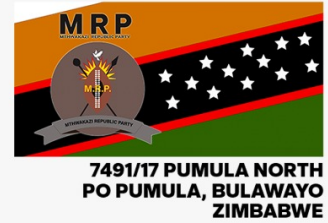

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- No competitive vote occurred.
- The African Union endorsement mechanism functioned to protect the candidate, not to assess it.

This is not a political opinion. It is a procedural fact. The seat was reserved before any vote was held. The Security Council did not receive a democracy. It received a government that threatens its citizens with death for petitioning peacefully, that is today dismantling its own constitutional limits on power, that has weaponised its police against social media commentary, and that presided over a genocide the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum has documented and attributed to members of the current president's inner circle.<sup>19</sup>

### What the World Should Ask

We ask the democracies that will sit alongside Zimbabwe in the Council chamber for the next two years to consider five propositions.

**First**, that the African Union endorsement mechanism, by permitting no competitive scrutiny, has not vindicated Zimbabwe. It has indicted itself.

**Second**, that Somalia's replacement by Zimbabwe is not a rotation of equivalents. It is a transfer of the seat from a recovering polity to a perpetrator polity that is actively dismantling its own constitution and intimidating its own population. The transfer should be noticed.

**Third**, that every vote Zimbabwe casts on sovereignty-over-accountability resolutions will be a public act. Predict the alignment with Russia and China. Document it. Remember it.

**Fourth**, that the doctrinal principle Israel acted upon in December 2025 — governance capacity as the criterion for legitimacy, not political solidarity<sup>20</sup> — now has a live test case in the chamber. The principle either applies universally, or it does not apply at all.

**Fifth**, that the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's documentation of Gukurahundi — which records that research suggests members of the ZANU inner circle, including the current President, may have organised the massacres<sup>21</sup> — now sits in unresolved tension with

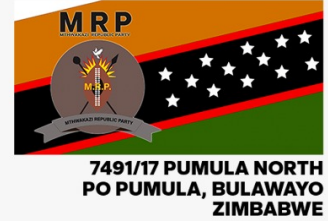

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Zimbabwe's membership of the body the United States co-chairs for global peace and security. The United States should say publicly what it intends to do with that tension.

## The Strategic Triangle: Israel, Somaliland, Mthwakazi

### Three peoples. One doctrine. One choice before the democratic world.

Israel survived decades of institutional delegitimisation, maintained governance, built institutions under siege, and was ultimately vindicated. It then acted on that vindication by becoming the first state to recognise Somaliland — a people that survived state-directed mass killing, declared the governing contract terminated by material breach, built functioning democratic institutions over three decades, and waited for the world to catch up.<sup>22</sup>

Mthwakazi survived Gukurahundi. Mthwakazi has declared the governing contract terminated by material breach. Mthwakazi is building institutional capacity through the MRP. Mthwakazi is waiting for the same recognition — while the state that committed that genocide sits in the Security Council chamber, threatens its own citizens with police force, and simultaneously rewrites its constitution to ensure it never faces a free election again.

The triangle is not rhetorical. It is structural. Israel recognised Somaliland because governance capacity is the correct criterion. Somaliland is now the operative model for what a people can build after mass atrocity. Mthwakazi is the next case on the same docket. The 3 June 2026 vote does not close that docket. It makes it more urgent.

We ask Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar and the Government of Israel to engage formally with the Mthwakazi Republic Party.<sup>23</sup> We ask the Republic of Somaliland to stand alongside us. We ask the United States to apply the USHMM's own documentation to the question now before it. The seat Zimbabwe holds from 1 January 2027 is a platform from which Mthwakazi's self-determination case will be most aggressively delegitimised. We ask our allies to be louder, not quieter, in the seven hundred and thirty days ahead.

## The MRP Position

The Mthwakazi Republic Party reiterates its long-standing commitments. We are a peaceful, registered political party. We submitted a self-determination petition to the SADC Secretariat in September 2023, carrying 25,880 signatures, registered under reference number 3951863.<sup>24</sup> We have asked, lawfully and publicly, to be heard. We have been met with presidential

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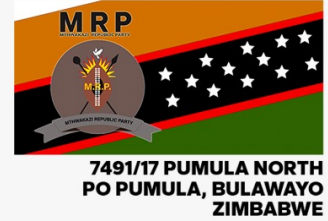

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threats of death — three times. We continue to ask. We will continue to ask. The Council seat just awarded to the government that has threatened us does not alter the lawfulness of our petition. It alters the moral weight of the silence that meets it. And the constitutional amendments now moving through Parliament do not alter our claim. They confirm it: a government that must rewrite its own constitution to avoid a free election, and weaponise its police against the citizens it claims to govern, has already lost the argument about whether its borders deserve the consent of the peoples inside them.

### MRP President Mr. Mqondisi Moyo said:

*“The state that committed Gukurahundi has just taken Somalia’s Security Council seat through an African Union mechanism that permitted no scrutiny. The state whose president publicly threatened to kill my colleagues for asking peacefully to be heard, three times over four years — and whose parliament is today voting to extend his rule by dismantling the constitutional limits his own party once agreed to, while his police threaten any citizen who objects — is now entrusted with decisions about global use of force.”*

*“The Universal Fragmentation Doctrine does not ask permission from the states it describes. It describes them. Today, it describes this: Gukurahundi has been seated at the United Nations Security Council; the constitutional coup is running in parallel; the police are on high alert against the citizens whose objection they were meant to protect. The triangle of Israel, Somaliland, and Mthwakazi is the answer the democratic world is being asked to give. We are asking them to give it.”*
