1: Political Security File

- The work on this file will be carried out through a quality collection and influence strategy. Below, I will present the files where there has been an impact:
 - Influence on internal elections within the Fatah movement.
 - Influence on internal elections within the Dahlan faction.
 - Influence on the attitudes of the leadership of the Palestinian Jihad.
 - Regularly transferring information through human sources across multiple channels (strengthening the movement's vision on specific issues, guiding the faction to support the movement's approaches, or making decisions that support them).
 - Continuing the process of guiding and influencing movement elements in the West Bank, developing communication support and assistance, managing their communication platforms, and using them to export positions and conduct activities aligned with the movement's trends and policies. This includes countering any opposing influences regarding issues in the Gaza Strip (such as convening the Central Council and calling for a boycott, involvement in municipal elections and calls for a boycott, avoidance of voting for Fatah lists in municipal elections—"Khassirhum Campaign", managing campaigns against political arrests, particularly of movement activists like Muhammad Amro, and recent calls for militant activities).
 - Influence, guidance, and control of information in the alternative framework, its activities and positions, and coordination for organizing specific activities in the European arena and its connection to the Gaza Strip. Prominent among these are 'protests against the Israeli European Council meeting, activities related to the Return and Liberation Week, sending messages from prominent figures to Palestinians in the diaspora,' and guiding the framework to export positions that serve the movement's approaches in numerous campaigns, including notable issues such as the gas issue and the maritime corridor, Arab involvement in elections within the Green Line, and the Return and Liberation Marches.

2: Security Communication and Public Opinion File:

1. Public Opinion Polls and Public Trends File

- Conducting Public Opinion Polls (general, specific, and gauging word on the street) to assess trends within the Palestinian public on various political and social issues, as follows:
 - Conducting 31 general surveys, 12 specific surveys, and 13 surveys to gauge word on the street during 2022-2023.
 - Special and objective surveys such as "public trends in legislative council elections, assessing the chances of the most suitable candidates on the lists, public trends and consensus regarding the evaluation of the 'Sword of Jerusalem' [Operation Guardian of the Walls], municipal elections, crises, Return Marches, the 'Revenge of the Free' round, youth, etc."
 - Organizational and governmental surveys such as "assessment of municipal performance, evaluation of government performance, evaluation of supervisors, and assessment of the Political Bureau session in coordination with the Planning Department."

- Control over the results of surveys from the Mapping Research Center, Azmi Bishara's Arab Indicator, the Student Gathering Center, Aman Center – Online Violence Survey, Christian Survey, Civil Security Surveys, Corruption Surveys, and Atlas Center Surveys.
- Preparation of a bi-monthly public opinion report monitoring current and pressing issues in the Gaza Strip, including opinions and public interaction on the Gazan streets and on social media, as well as local radio stations, in addition to opinions from selected commentators.
- Readiness to conduct sampling during every election campaign held in the Gaza Strip, with the aim of delivering the results exclusively and initially to the movement throughout Election Day.

2. Security Communication File (Defensive and Offensive):

- Management of numerous communication campaigns – both counter-campaigns and offensive campaigns – aimed at sowing confusion and influencing opponents, including the following notable ones:
 - Targeting hostile activists who incite against the movement, particularly foreign activists, by neutralizing them, damaging their reputation, and exposing their schemes and handlers. This activity has led to the retreat of several activists, such as Amer Balousha, although the attacks against them have also resulted in some being labeled with derogatory titles that have stuck.

- A targeted attack against several hate-filled individuals, aimed at damaging their public image. Notable among these individuals are Hussein al-Sheikh, Majid Faraj, Azzam al-Ahmad, Tawfik Tirawi, and Mohammad Shtayyeh...)
 - Ongoing work on the internal divisions within Fatah and the split between the Abbas and Dahlan factions. Numerous communication campaigns were managed across dedicated platforms (such as Alattal, Aursat Alattal, Shurfa Almuhabarat, and Sakhija Albrics) attempting to create the image of a mutual attack from both sides.**
 - Addressing large-scale communication campaigns against the movement in response to events that stir public opinion, such as suicide cases, municipal issues and the dismantling of stalls, taxes...
- Dealing with protest movements against the movement (e.g., the 30/7 Movement (Electricity Movement), Want to Live, etc.) using several strategies:
 - Redirecting and diverting public attention in the Gaza Strip to other issues such as existing concessions for citizens, welfare service salaries, and high school graduation results.
 - Sowing division and defaming those responsible for the protest movement, linking them to militant activities such as "Hamza al-Masri's registration," which diverted the movement from its intended path.
 - Publishing leaks from intelligence officers that incite opposition against Hamas in Gaza and their employment in response to media materials published against them.
 - Damaging the reputation of the movement and its responsible figures before it is launched, and associating them with the occupation.
 - Ideological attacks on those responsible for the movement.
 - Understanding the movement's trend, creating relationships with rival activists through virtual accounts, monitoring their plans, and sowing discord and confusion among them.
 - Implementing an early detection system for monitoring security, community, and political threat factors, and conducting activities to manage and contain events through integration and collaboration with offensive communication.
 - Defensive activities to expose misleading and false information through clarification and publication on our various platforms, using the "Edah" platform.

3. Electronic Team File

- Increasing the activity of the electronic team belonging to the organization, consisting of over 160 members within the Gaza Strip. This effort greatly contributes to promoting the movement's narrative, attacking opponents, reducing their communication tools, and countering dubious calls on social media. The electronic team has over 1,115,495 followers on social networks, in addition to publishing in groups and open markets with more than 24 million followers and employing advanced technologies designed to flood social media in a very short time.

- The social media messaging team has significantly contributed to combating and limiting the rivals' narrative by deleting hundreds of posts, accounts, and pages of the movement's opponents. The notable results include:

- Closing dozens of pages and accounts of various opponents (security, political, activists...), particularly those inciting.

- Destroying publications and platforms of the occupation. It is known that on social networks, it is difficult to close occupation platforms or remove publications from them for several reasons. However, by analyzing these platforms and exposing their vulnerabilities, the messaging teams have succeeded in closing many platforms, including those harming brotherhood among Al-Qassam, and publishing names and photos as "most wanted," "the hunted," etc.

- Removing significant platforms of media associated with Fatah (such as Awdeh Channel, Digital Media, Almunakhal, Kashf Almastour, WikiLeaks, etc.).

3: Support for Decision-Making and Situation Assessment File

- Assistance to the movement's leadership through the most significant information products (strategic assessments, research situation assessments, interpretations, simulations, periodic information reports, and special data analysis documents). Additionally, updating the movement on the political and security trends of the various factors influencing the field (Palestinian, Arab, regional, and Israeli) in a way that assists in decision-making. Among the notable products developed in this area:
 - Development of a simulation regarding Zionist activity scenarios related to the West Bank, designed to address the situation of unrest: the simulation assessed the continuation of the rapid attack scenario and local actions to neutralize threat factors in the West Bank, and the transition to large-scale operations against specific areas in the event of escalating resistance activities (as occurred in the Jenin operation).
 - Situational assessment regarding the option of conducting local elections in the Gaza Strip: The document discusses the threat factors associated with such an option, and the conditions that need to be met before choosing this option to ensure avoidance of negative consequences at the time of selection.
 - Development of an informational research study on trends in Egypt regarding the Gaza Strip and Hamas from 2017 to 2021 and the movement's vision for addressing these trends. The research was distributed to the members of the executive committee and relevant contacts involved with Egypt. The study helps in forming a deeper understanding of the factors influencing Egypt's actions regarding Hamas.
 - Formulation of a work plan to address the handling of the parties following Abbas's departure. The document outlined the expected conduct of the parties succeeding Abbas and contributed to the development of the movement's plan for managing Abbas's succession.
 - Development of a document on how to handle the Arab vote in Knesset elections, which contributed to guiding the movement's decision regarding the choice of whether or not Arab citizens of Israel (the Arabs of 48') should participate in the Zionist elections.

- Situation assessments and analytical documents discussing issues and emerging events related to Zionist matters, and examining Zionist trends in various areas (Gaza, the West Bank, the northern arena, normalization).

Following the subject, we would like to inform you that we have completed the preparation of Research Survey No. 91. The survey results have been revised according to the practices followed in previous surveys, and the results have been sent by the source to the center in Ramallah.

The center published the results of the survey sent to them last Thursday on the center's page. Accordingly, a media material (media report) was prepared with the survey results. Additionally, contact was made with Brother Tamer Almisshal from Al Jazeera to present the report on the channel, and the report was presented as-is on Al Jazeera.

The media material was distributed across various local and Arab media outlets and among activists. It received significant attention and became a "trend."
